Of course the basic information about each state will also be covered. We'll use geographic organizers and "The Everything Kids' States Book". We may ask that you find a couple of facts at home, it should not take long to complete any given assignments. Homework is essential to make sure that stay on the same page each week. While the teachers and assistants will be available to give some help, successful students should be able to read and write independently. There will also be some homework assignments that students will be asked to complete. Greece was one of the first great cultures and many of our modern words (triangle, dentist) and cultural references (Achilles' heel, Athens) are derived from these ancient tales. Each week we will read together myth from "Classic Greek Myths to Read Aloud" by William Russell (a terrific text for children of all ages). We will practice note taking as a class and each student will be expected to use these notes to write a paragraph of 4-6 sentences for homework each week. We will also learn some common Greek and Latin root words & their English derivatives and do some crafts to create our own keepsake quality book</p> <p>Each student will need to provide their own paper for note taking, colored pencils or crayons, scissors, glue and a 2-pocket folder (to hold book pages). Class fee: \$4 for materials.</p>
<p>The History of Music Ages 11-14 Rebecca Minnix jean.beca@verizon.net</p>	<p>Do you like to sing about what you have learned? This will be an exciting class in which we will learn the history of several hymns of the faith as well as a few patriotic songs. We will be learning briefly about the authors and composers. We will discuss what may have been going on at the point in history during which the song was written - or what may have been going on in the authors life at that time. Each week we will learn the lyrics to one of the songs and how to sing it. We will review the songs we have learned in previous weeks until we have developed quite a repertoire! We will also briefly touch on the basics of how music is written.</p> <p>Please note: the songs will not repeat from the previous semester. Therefore, if you have taken the class and would like to take it again, you will be learning NEW songs.</p>

Why does the history of our nation matter today? Our republic has its flaws, for sure; no government of man can equal the perfect King, Jesus. Until He comes, we have an opportunity to live in a free nation, which could cost us everything!</p> <p>Come and explore the foundation upon which our nation was founded. Even before the Revolutionary War and the famous founding fathers, there were men who walked America with spiritual awakening and religious freedom as their aim!</p> <p>How did that season prepare us to become “one nation, under God?” When did that phrase even become a part of the pledge of allegiance, and why? And now that some Americans would like to see it removed from the pledge, how do we live as Christians in an increasingly secular nation? Could it be that our God could be calling us back to our roots and to Himself? These are only a few questions we will be challenged with this fall! The class will culminate with an hour of prayer for our nation; parents are welcome to attend!</p> <p>Please note: There are many sides to the stories of the founding fathers. My personal belief is that most of them were sincere Christian men with little to gain from politics as we know it, and flawed like the rest of us. They may be judged by their own words and actions, the fruit of their labors.</p> <p>Also, we will address in the later classes certain subjects of immorality in our nation that currently are in debate, social and political, as we approach the mid-term election season. I would strongly suggest subscribing to God’s World News for your kids to get age-appropriate current events. My main point of debate as to where our nation’s heartbeat is will be centered around the social-political issue of “sanctity of life.” How do our current laws stand up to Biblical Truth?</p> <p>Here is a rough outline of what we’ll cover: Week 1: Why America? Early settlements and brief history of the Awakenings Week 2: Christianity & Culture in the Colonies Week 3: Who were our founding fathers? What did they believe? Week 4: How did their beliefs influence the Declaration of Independence? Week 5: ...the Constitution? ... the Bill of Rights? Week 6: ...our form of government? Week 7: What is Separation of Church and State? Week 8: Was America a Christian nation then? Week 9: Is America a Christian nation now? This course is intended to help students, understand the elements of good story telling, identify & respond to messages even if they are not obvious at first and to understand the techniques used by filmmakers to involve us emotionally as we watch. In this way students will develop the ability to critique stories whether on film or in print. Movies will be watched at home. A worksheet & written composition will be completed for class discussion/presentation. This class will run one time per month. There is a small fee for copying.</p>

<p>Introduction to Poetry: Forms and Elements Ages 12-15 Elizabeth Patsch patsches6@verizon.net</p>	<p>Using this Progeny Press study guide by Judy Cook, the class would be a three part study on the types, elements and forms of poetry. There are 18 lessons in this guide, which may be supplemented with poetic terminology from another book, <i>Figuratively Speaking</i>. Some of the topics covered include imagery, meter, sonnets, haiku, and ballads. Homework may consist of reading and writing poems, completing the worksheets, a report on a famous poet, and memorizing and reciting a poem. The majority of the class time will be spent on improving the students' chess game through practice games. Some weeks, will include "mini lessons" on tactics and strategies. This new format will also allow for more individualized instruction, while other students are involved in their games. The class will include a semester long chess tournament with place medals for the top three!</p>

Students may bring scissors or other tools if they desire, but they are not required for the class.</p> <p>Class DOES NOT meet when Movie as Literature classes meet. Class size limited to 10.</p>
<p>And....Action! - Afternoon Drama Club Ages 8-14 Rebecca Minnix jean.beca@verizon.net Marcy Lightcap marcylightcap@comcast.net</p>	<p>This afternoon class will go through the entire process involved with putting on a skit, scene or play - from the audition process to the dress rehearsal. Students will learn various acting techniques including voice projection, enunciation, overcoming "stage fright", as well as how to get into character and staying in character. Most importantly, we will focus on doing all things for the glory of God. The skits and scenes will have a Christian theme - and we will discuss how drama can be an effective witnessing tool. After all, only what is done for Jesus Christ really matters!</p> <p>There will be a role for every student that participates, although some roles will be smaller than others. Students all benefit from the class as they learn acting techniques and how to work in a group. Each week we will begin with skill practice and end with rehearsal. We will also split into small groups so that no time is wasted - if any one group is not part of the immediate rehearsal, they will be doing other fun activities such as short skits or improvisations. This class is meant to be fun, but in order to accomplish our goals and have every student enjoy the class, it is important that order be maintained. If a student cannot control his or her behavior we will first speak to the student, secondly speak to the parents, and if negative behavior continues the student will be asked to leave the class. It is our sincere hope this will not be an issue. We want everyone to learn and have a good time.</p> <p>This class meets every week of co-op. We do NOT take off the weeks when Book Club or Movie as Literature meets. Student performances will be held at the Thanksgiving Feast and the Christmas Party. If you know in advance that you cannot attend either of these events, please let us know.
