exceptions. It starts with phonics-based spelling. Students learn to read the "write" way by spelling their way into reading. The student hears a word and writes it (without copying) through a guided dictation technique. The word is read after having written it accurately and analyzes it using a limited number of reliable rules. After a student can mentally think by sound to write a word correctly (spell), he can more naturally see a word and blend the sounds together (read).

This integrated language arts approach includes phonics, penmanship, literature, logic, grammar, composition, vocabulary building, figurative language, dictionary skills, Greek and Latin roots, and comprehension.
